# **Truths from 1 Thessalonians (4:13-5:11)**

The Thessalonians were puzzled. Some had died and they wondered if they had missed the return of Jesus. Paul gave them these truths:

- 1. We don't need to grieve like those who have no hope.
- 2. Dead believers are raised first and will return with Jesus.
- 3. We will meet them and Jesus and be together forever.
- 4. Jesus' return will be like a "thief in the night"—a surprise.
- 5. Believers need to be ready and not be surprised.
- 6. Believers will receive salvation instead of God's wrath.
- 7. We need to encourage each other with these words.

# **Truths from 2 Thessalonians** (2:1 - 12)
