# **Matthew 24-25** (Review of a Key Passage!)

Matthew 24 has the only real timeline in the Bible. Jesus uses literal (not symbolic) language. Here are the events He gives us:

- 1. Destruction of Jerusalem.
- 2. **Tough Times**. False religions, wars, natural disasters, persecution of believers, spiritual apathy, and gospel success.
- 3. **Tribulation.** A short, incredibly intense period of tough times.
- 4. **Second Coming.** Glorious Appearing and Rapture. (24:26-31)
- 5. Final Judgment. (25:31-45)
- 6. **Eternity.** (25:46)

## A Key Passage on the Resurrection: 1 Corinthians 15

### **Truths from 1 Corinthians 15:1-58**

Biblical definition: A resurrection is what happened to Jesus, a return to life in a new immortal body.
