Tonight's Bible Verse – Matthew 7:24-27

"Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash."

Step One – Honest Evaluation (Review)

Step one is personal evaluation. What sins, attitudes, beliefs, and practices need to go? What holds you back from growing? How many roaches are we willing to have in our milkshakes?

Step Two – Learning to listen to Jesus (Review)

Step two is learning to listen to Jesus amid a thousand other voices around us. You can't follow the leader unless you know who the leader is and what He wants. And Jesus is our leader.

Step Three - Doing

Knowing what Jesus wants is not enough. Listening to Jesus is not enough. Jesus made that clear in Matthew. Calling him "Lord, Lord" (in verse 21) is not enough. The conclusion of his *Sermon on the Mount* (the clearest statement of Christian behavior in the Bible) is a strong statement. Hearing His words and not doing them leads to disaster. Only hearing and doing leads to real growth.

It's who we are. Jesus did not call us students, for we are not just learners. He called us disciples, learners and doers!

How well do you imitate? How well do you play *Simon Says*? (Which in our terms is really *Jesus Says.*)
