God has shaped this world and His church using Spiritual Awakenings. It was true in the Old and New Testament eras and in the many years since. It has been especially true in our own country. The purpose of this study is to look at the history of awakenings. A study of those awakenings (1) restores our faith in God, (2) gives us hope for the future, and (3) instructs us on our role in the work of God.

We are desperately in need of a spiritual awakening in our country!

### What Is A Spiritual Awakening (or Revival)?

"Sometimes heaven seems to come down to Earth. Men and women with lives devastated by sin find in Jesus the grace to repent and the power to change. Wrongs are made right. Broken homes reunite. The church, made beautiful in holiness, reaches out in love to serve a hurting and lost world. This is revival."

This happens, of course, to individuals regularly. In awakenings, it happens almost simultaneously to thousands and even millions. That's what we pray for. That's what we long for.

They occur irregularly and are often spontaneous, so we can't plan for them or predict them. It's been 100+ years since the last major awakening in our country and 50+ years since the last one. We need one, and I pray it comes soon and that we will be part of it!

### The Cycle

There is a regular cycle we can see in the Old Testament *Period of Judges* and during the *Periods of the United and Divided Kingdoms*. It's been easy to see in church history and in our own country. This cycle will continue into the future—with one notable exception. (In the end times, sin will continue until there is a final ending and judgment.)

# First Example from the Period of the Judges, Judges 3:7-11
