Key Thought & Introduction: We teach the Bible illogically and we tell stories out of order. We end up with knowledge—but with no real understanding of how it all fits together. Though the Bible is made up of 66 books, it is a *whole*, and it tells the story of God from “*In the beginning, God,*” to “*Yes, I am coming soon.*”

The Bible is not organized by chronology, so our goal in this class is to teach the Bible systematically, so we can see the Bible as a whole and therefore see how God worked throughout history. We will also be reminded that He is still at work!
